## Matthew 12:33-37 (NIV)

Jesus said to the Pharisees, <sup>33</sup>“Make a tree good and its fruit will be good, or make a tree bad and its fruit will be bad, for a tree is recognized by its fruit. <sup>34</sup>You brood of vipers, how can you who are evil say anything good? For the mouth speaks what the heart is full of. <sup>35</sup>A good man brings good things out of the good stored up in him, and an evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in him. <sup>36</sup>But I tell you that everyone will have to give account on the day of judgment for every empty word they have spoken. <sup>37</sup>For by your words you will be acquitted, and by your words you will be condemned.”

## James 3 (NIV)

**3** Not many of you should become teachers, my fellow believers, because you know that we who teach will be judged more strictly. <sup>2</sup>We all stumble in many ways. Anyone who is never at fault in what they say is perfect, able to keep their whole body in check.

<sup>3</sup>When we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we can turn the whole animal. <sup>4</sup>Or take ships as an example. Although they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are steered by a very small rudder wherever the pilot wants to go. <sup>5</sup>Likewise, the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. <sup>6</sup>The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole body, sets the whole course of one’s life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell.

<sup>7</sup>All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and sea creatures are being tamed and have been tamed by mankind, <sup>8</sup>but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison.

<sup>9</sup>With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse human beings, who have been made in God’s likeness. <sup>10</sup>Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this should not be. <sup>11</sup>Can both fresh water and salt water flow from the same spring? <sup>12</sup>My brothers and sisters, can a fig tree bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? Neither can a salt spring produce fresh water.

<sup>13</sup>Who is wise and understanding among you? Let them show it by their good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom. <sup>14</sup>But if you harbor bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast about it or deny the truth. <sup>15</sup>Such “wisdom” does not come down from heaven but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. <sup>16</sup>For where you have envy and selfish ambition, there you find disorder and every evil practice.

<sup>17</sup>But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. <sup>18</sup>Peacemakers who sow in peace reap a harvest of righteousness.

**More from Andrew Browning's recent Prayer Letter (no.13):**

## **Tanzania**

- Please pray for Tanzania and its people. After a remarkably safe run with respect to the pandemic, it is now undergoing a second wave. There are unofficial reports of renewed deaths from respiratory illnesses in the countryside. We have re-started use of PPE and other measures in our hospital.
- Give thanks that Dr Mbise, who we sponsored to undertake his obstetrics training, is now on staff full time. It is wonderful to have him join us.

## **South Sudan and Uganda.**

- Because of Covid I was unable to go to Sth Sudan in March 2020 and many of the fistula patients had to return home, disappointed and untreated. I am praying that I will be able to arrive and operate from mid March. Pray for God's intervention so patients won't be disappointed again.
- Pray also for the Lutheran Church in Sth Sudan who are opening a maternity hospital alongside the fistula unit. We are partnering to help set up the unit and we will place volunteers. Two volunteers were due to arrive from Holland in March but with the Lutheran Church we've decided to postpone the arrivals and opening until June.
- I am also hoping to get to Uganda in March. Many patients are waiting so please pray for smooth travel so I can get to these places.
